

Crack your windows if you want fresh air while driving, but don't open them wide enough to let your dog hang its head out the window. Allowing a dog to hang its head too far out a car window and exposure to wind, dust and flying debris can cause dehydration, conjunctivitis, and ear infections.

Consider securing your dog in a crate or with a seat belt extension for dogs (available from pet supply catalogs) when traveling by car.

If you have a truck, drive with your dog in the cab or safely secured in a crate or harness designed for pickup trucks (available from pet supply catalogs.) Jumping or being thrown from the back of a truck when you swerve or come to a sudden stop can cause your dog to be hit by another car, as well as broken bones, deep abrasions, and head/chest trauma.



Never leave your dog in a parked truck or car during the heat of summer.
